



Birthday Fund

The Birthday Fund was started in 2012 by Sisterhood Board Member, Jodi Malcom and supported by Sisterhood leadership. Its mission is to aid non-profit organizations that improve the lives of women and girls in New York City. Less than 2 percent of charitable giving nationwide goes to women and girls despite continuing gender inequities. With generous contributions from East End Temple members to honor their birthdays and the birthdays of loved ones, Sisterhood transforms individual and family donations into annual grants of \$500-\$2,500. Birthday gifts become acts of giving, not receiving, and more meaningful as they are transformed into active outreach by our community.
